# Choosing

Greetings in the name of Jesus! And welcome to October! When the Editor let me know that it was my turn to contribute to the newsletter, I was preparing for the LWML retreat with the theme of: Treasured! Although it's now in the books, that retreat and its topic have heavily influenced this month's letter.

In Deuteronomy the LORD speaks to His people saying: For you are a people holy to the LORD your God. The LORD your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on the face of the earth to be His people, His treasured possession (7:6).

Choosing. It's an important task in our lives; and one that we perform more times than we know every day. We choose what to wear, what to eat, what route we might take to get from point A to B, do we answer that call/text or not? It's a list that could go on forever. Our making such choices is, in fact, such an important aspect of life that the advertising industry makes billions if not trillions of dollars helping businesses to "help" you in the choices you make.

On the flip side, everyone likes to be chosen. Remember those uncomfortable moments on the playground? We all ached to be chosen first or second or somewhere nearer the top than to be the last one chosen for a team. Being chosen first meant that we were the best! And it's not just people that like to be chosen. Businesses like you to choose them as well. They will offer specials and sales to attract you; and when you arrive, they will strive to make your time with them an experience to be remembered and shared – so more people will choose to spend their dollars in their store.

Some of the choices we make aren't cut and dried. We have, therefore, come up with ways in which to help us make our choices. We can cast lots (which is very Biblical). We can draw straws or throw darts. We can make use of a computer algorithm or simply close our eyes and grab or point. And when all else fails we have eeny-meeny-miney moe. Choices are, after all, at times very difficult to make!

Thankfully none of this has anything to do with the whys or means by which God chooses us.

He simply calls us by His Grace. He blesses us with the gift of faith so that we are then able to trust in Him. But it was because the LORD loved you and kept the oath He swore to your forefathers that He brought you out with a mighty hand and redeemed you from the land of slavery, from the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt. Know therefore that the LORD your God is God; <u>He is the faithful God, keeping His covenant of</u> love to a thousand generations of those who and His love Him keep commands. **Deuteronomy 7:6-9**


