If you attended one of the district retreats this month, you got to spend time in God's Word. I know you are all familiar with the words from Jeremiah 29:11;

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Often, we stop there. But verse 12 continues "Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you." What an Almighty God we serve! He has a plan for each of us. The spreadsheet will detail the number of subscriptions ordered by each group and the cost for the group. The price for each subscription is \$7.50 for up to nine sent to the same address. If ten or more are ordered and shipped to the same address, then the price for each subscription drops to \$6.00 each. We are asking each group to confirm the number of subscriptions being sent and to send a check for the total amount to the zone treasurer. The zone treasurers will forward the subscription receipts to the district treasurer in January or February to pay for the subscription costs as they become due. Praise God! Last year we were able to match the costs with the receipts. The Quarterly subscription costs are separate from any Mites offerings or membership assessments. Thank you in advance for keeping the numbers and receipts current. Just a note: If you order 10 subscriptions for \$60, it is like getting two free, since the cost of nine subscriptions is \$67.50. And surely there is another woman in your congregation who would love to get a copy!

#### **Mission Grant Update**

I hope everyone is doing well.

Since last quarter we have only paid two grants. Those were for Faith Lutheran Child Care & Preschool for \$6,000 to be used for flooring for renovated house and Sun shade or sail for the playground which was paid in July. Also paid in September was a grant to Inspiritus – Building Healthy Families for \$5,000 to be used to purchase supplies, caring closet items, and meeting meals.

- The remaining grants to be paid are listed below in the order they are in the queue
- Third installment for Financial Aid for Professional Church Workers -- \$3,750
- Oasis Women's Ministry Renovating an area for Bible study -- \$5,000
- Trinity Lutheran Childcare Ministries Purchase of playground equipment -- \$7,500
- Concordia Seminary Ft. Wayne Financial Support for the Food Co-op to purchase food -- \$1,000
- Healing Hearts with the Gospel Japan Earthquake & Tsunami Ministry 10 years Later -- \$6,600
- Fourth and final installment for Financial Aid for Professional Church Workers -- \$3,750

Please continue to give your mites so that we can pay these grants as soon as we can.

On Sept. 11, **The ladies at Grace, Knoxville,** hosted a presentation by <u>StreetHopeTN.org</u> for the whole congregation and especially invited teens and their parents. This group works to fight "Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking" in our area and is building a new home to help young girls recover from being caught in this web of slavery. It was a great turnout! We had only 4 teens, but our 2 pastors, DCE, 2 other men and a lot of women. It was an eye opening presentation! We will be praying for the victims and finding ways to help in the future as the Lord guides.

#### **Christ the King LWML Summer Project**

The LWML Society of Christ the King, Memphis, had a summer project in July. We had some guest speakers from Life Choices in May, and they gave us a presentation of what they do. Life Choices, a faith-based, non-profit organization, helps pregnant girls and women that are trying to decide whether to keep their baby. First, a sonogram is taken to make sure there is a viable pregnancy. The mother can see that it is a baby in her womb even at 7 weeks. Once it is determined that the woman is pregnant, she talks with a counselor. She will make the decision to keep her baby, give the baby up for adoption or have an abortion. Fortunately, Life Choices helps the women keep the baby or give them up for adoption most of the time. While it is a hard choice, they do get a lot of help from this organization.

After the wonderful presentation, we decided to raise money for them and buy items for their Baby Boutique. The Baby Boutique is a room filled with clothes, diapers, wipes, blankets, toys, bottles and all kinds of things needed for a newborn baby and up to 9 months old. The moms-to-be can "shop" in their boutique with points received for completing parenting classes and counseling.

Our congregation and Society donated \$340.00 and bought items from the list we were given which consisted of clothes, diapers, wipes, pacifiers, baby powder, bibs and much more. I hope that you choose Life Choices for future service projects, they need all the help they can get!




