Take the Pledge - Heed the Call!

First, I want to say a HUGE thank you to everyone who attended our 27th biennial convention in Clarksville, Tennessee! And, especially, countless thanks to the convention host committee who worked so hard to make it happen! What a joy it was to sing with Wendysue, attend opening worship at Grace Lutheran Church, and be on the edge of our seats as we listened to Rev. Dr. Gregory Seltz! WOW!



Among all those incredible experiences, I was especially touched by saying the League Pledge as we always do at conventions. This time the words just hit me differently. I've included the whole pledge below but highlighted the words that jumped out to me.

In fervent gratitude for the Savior's dying love and His blood-bought gift of redemption we dedicate ourselves to Him with all that we are and have; and in obedience to His call for workers in the harvest fields, we pledge Him our willing service wherever and whenever He has need of us. We consecrate to our Savior our hands to work for Him, our feet to go on His errands, our voice to sing His praises, our lips to proclaim His redeeming love, our silver and our gold to extend His Kingdom, our will to do His will, and every power of our life to the great task of bringing the lost and the erring into eternal fellowship with Him. Amen.

Honestly, I think it was just the word "obedience" that caught my attention. Of course, I spend most of my time being disobedient, always plagued by those "sins of omission". How reassuring are these words from Paul's letter to Titus:

For we ourselves were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, slaves to various passions and pleasures, passing our days in malice and envy, hated by others and hating one another. But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:3-7, ESV).

Paul reminds me that, as disobedient as I am, God loves me and has made me his own. Then, following along our convention theme of "planting seeds of faith", I am reminded that it's not just the planting and watering but also the reaping. In John, chapter 4, we are reminded that "the fields are white for harvest" and just like those Samaritans who were eager to hear what Jesus had to say, there are people all around us today who need to hear the Good News.

Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together (John 4:34-36, ESV).

So, let's all keep planting, watering, and sharing as we heed the call for workers in the harvest fields!

But until then, we continue in this journey of unknown length, but knowing, God-willing, our final destination...paradise, basking in His presence, free from all those issues we've been made to deal with in the here-and-now...as His people, riding in His Ark, the church, weathering this storm we know as life... now and forever, Amen.

Mission Grant Committee Update

During the 27th Biennial LWML Mid-South District Convention, voting delegates voted on which of the 23 mission grants on the ballot would be funded. They chose 13 grants to be fully funded and 1 grant to be partially funded. Voting delegates also approved a \$105,000.00 budget for Mission Grants.

There are two pages for this table. The first page lists the grants that will be funded with the amount requested, paid, remaining, and date paid. Also listed are the vote sequence and request for payment sequence. Grants are paid in the order in which they are requested.

The second page lists the grants that were not funded. These are listed in vote sequence. These can be funded in the order they are listed if there are any remaining funds after all 14 grants listed on the first page have been paid.

On both pages, each grant name is a link to a fact sheet with information about the grant, website link, and a Facebook link.

I am happy to report that we have paid four (4) grants already for a total of \$22,000.00. This means we have \$83,000.00 of the \$105,000.00 remaining to be paid.

I know many local groups do not meet during the summer. However, I urge you to continue sending your mites so we can pay additional grants during the month of August.

Spring Work Day, Arkansas River Valley Zone April 23, 2022

A wonderful day was had by all that attended the spring work day. We began our day with worship and fellowship at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Fort Smith, AR. Fifteen(15) LWLML members were remembered that we had lost to their heavenly home in the last 2 years.

Thirty-five(35) ladies attended with 1 pastor and 1 quest. After the service we began our work projects:

- Eighty(80) heart shaped pillows were stuffed and closed for cardiac patients at Mercy Hospital Fort Smith
- Eleven(11) loomed knit caps were made for the newborns at Mercy Hospital Fort Smith
- Eighty-three(83) cards were made for Phil's Friends, a Lutheran support group for cancer patients.

A love offering of \$284 and 2 quad canes were collected for CURE(Compassionate Utilization of Resources), a nonprofit local organization that provides needed supplies and equipment to foster kids through DHS and others who request assistance with medical equipment and they also send items to third would countries in need.

The ingathering was for the blessing box at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church. 192 nonperishable items and cash were collected.

Two of the projects exceeded the 80 for the 80th year of LWML!!!!!!

LWML Meeting Manager, Arlene Naasz, brought greetings from LWML President Debbie Larson and shared news from the LWML.

LCMS Mid-South District President, Rev. Dr. Roger Paavola and his wife Pat also joined us. We are so thankful for President Paavola's support and encouragement! Keynote speaker, Rev. Dr. Gregory Seltz, Executive Director of the Lutheran Center for Religious Liberty, encouraged us to be like Esther and to act as "blockers" for those who bring the Good News to others.

We heard from representatives of our two Gifts from the Heart recipients - Hope Pregnancy Center, Clarksville, TN and Hope Unlimited Crisis Pregnancy Center, Paducah, KY. The collection of items for these pregnancy centers included 128 packages of diapers, 143 packages of wipes, 123 baby toiletry items, 34 jugs of detergent, and \$1,429 in gift cards and cash. Three of our Young Woman Representatives to the 2021 LWML convention in Lexington, Kentucky shared their experiences with us. We are so thankful for these young women!

All the YWRs and Junior YWRs attending the convention had dinner with our special guests and then a Bible study after the opening worship service.

They had been married for seventy years. Now Marie was feeling overwhelmed as people were regularly calling her about investments, insurance coverage, and whether or not she was ready to move into assisted living. Even her daughter asked her if she had reviewed her will. The burden of these decisions was overwhelming and Marie became angry and just wanted everyone to leave her alone.

It is wise to do good planning while both spouses are alive. It is even better to make sure that those plans are written down, detailing an organized, planned approach to caring for the financial gifts God has placed in your care. It is unwise to expect that children or other relatives will be able to jump in, without any prior involvement, to make the same kind of choices you have chosen all your life. They will lovingly do their part, but you may be asking them to carry out a difficult or impossible task. Planning can bring peace of mind. When a good plan is in place, seeking interaction with professional legal, financial or tax advisors can be seen as continuing that plan. Asking children to help will also be part of that continuance.

Now is a good day to start. Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can highlight areas of decision and point you to the right professionals to help you write down a plan, all the while expressing your love for your family and your devotion to the Lord. Her primary focus has been expanding relationships with the pediatric and adult clinics at Vanderbilt University, and shining a spotlight on the need for continued follow up and treatment as children transition into teen and then adult care.






Young Women's Representative Gets Married


