Mission Accomplished

I am glad to report that all Mission Grants that were chosen for the 2020-2024 biennium have been paid except for two grants that were withdrawn. The withdrawn grants were "Healing Hearts with the Gospel - Japan Earthquake & Tsunami Ministry 10 Years Later (Partial Funding at \$6,600)" and "New Beginnings - Children with learning needs - (Requested \$5,000)" which had been extended from the 2018-2020 biennium. We were able to use surplus funds to pay out the only mission grant that was not funded for the 2020-2022 biennium which was "Transforming Churches Network - Funds for annual Discipleship Conference for \$4,000". Praise God that we were able to pay for all the viable Mission Grant requests from the 2020-2022 biennium!

The Mission Grants Committee (Dorothy Edwards, Mitzi Dixon, and Rebecca Robinson) met via Zoom in February with a follow-up meeting in March also attended by President Candy Habich. During these meetings we discussed the 24 Mission Grant applications that were received. It was decided that all but one be placed on the ballot. This makes a total of 23 Mission Grant applications that will be voted on in Clarksville.

I look forward to seeing you all at the LWML Mid-South District Convention in Clarksville, TN from June 10-12, 2022.

Intentionally including these sisters is an awesome thing because one of the hard parts of being deaf or even hard of hearing is simply not being included. It becomes an awkward situation at times and most of us don't have the training to know how to respond so we just turn away.

It is my goal as your deaf ministry liaison to make you more comfortable so, that if you are ever in a situation that you will react with compassion and some knowledge. Learning ASL is actually fun and increases your idle brain cells – just like puzzles do. I am a student just like you and it takes practice like most everything else.

There are Youtube videos that are very good that I use for practice. I like simple easy stuff so these two videos are just that. Google's "[ASL for Kids](#)" and find "[Superhero/Sign language for kids](#)". Any of the little songs, phrases, etc., is good to watch and learn. My grandson who is four loves them. Also "[takelessons.com](#)" is a great site. It shows 12 Basic ASL Phrases and words and if you scroll down the page a bit there is a lady named Victoria that will teach you some phrases and how to answer them as well.

The ASL alphabet is a must and a good place to start. This way you can hand spell anything if you don't know the sign for it. It is available when you search for [ASL alphabet](#).

Just give it a try and see if you can learn a few phrases, words or the alphabet. Set a goal and learn a few a week. Use them with your family and friends until you are comfortable. Make it fun. Kids love doing this so it makes a good family activity with your own kids or grandchildren. Make a game out of it, kind of like, name that sign! If your church has ladies that are deaf that could be included in your LWML events, please let me know. I will do all I can to help them get involved.

I pray for the deaf and pray that they find LWML to help them navigate some friendly waters. I ask that you pray for me to be led by the Holy Spirit to minister to those God has ready for me to meet. Blessings to you as we learn together!

ENDOWMENT FUND READY FOR FUND REQUEST APPLICATIONS



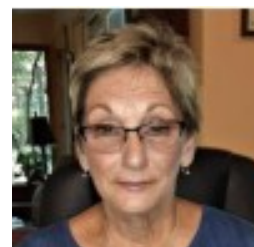

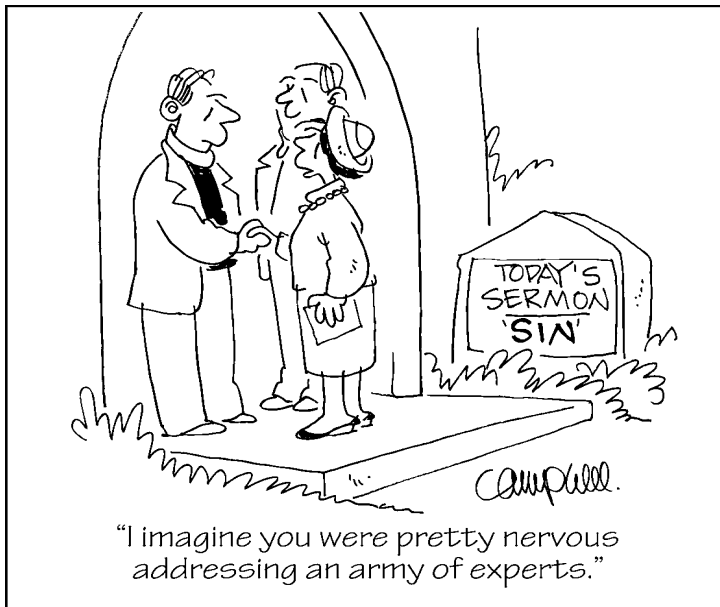
Gifts Of Love Ministry

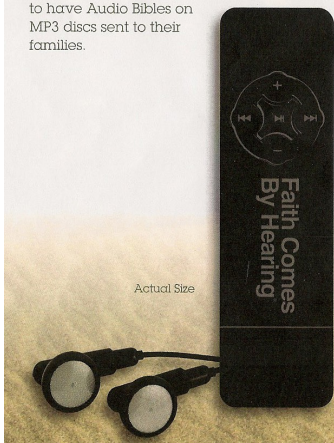
