

### A Clean Heart? Not so much.

God gives the Holy Spirit to anyone who asks:

*If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him (Luke 11:13)!*

I am a baptized child of God and received the Holy Spirit through my baptism:

*And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38).*

The Helper is here to teach me:

*But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you (John 14:26).*

The Holy Spirit gives me hope:

*May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope (Romans 15:13).*

And then I smile.

May the Holy Spirit forever live in your hearts.

## The Augsburg Confessor

Grace, mercy, and peace be to you from God our Father, and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

*What is a Church?*

*For what purpose has Christ established the Church?*

*Is our focus on the right things within the Church?*

*What do the Scriptures say about Church?*

The way we use the word “church”, we often talk of it more in the way of a social club or a gathering place. We tell friends that we “go to church”, and by that, we mean that we gather with other believers at 93 Augsburg Road in London, Arkansas on Sundays (that’s my church!). Or, if we have a social event – say a youth group gathering at the bowling alley – we may tell other friends that we are going to a “church event” and that they are welcome to join!

But is that all church is? Is it just an adjective to describe an event we have together or an address at which we gather on Sundays? Is that what we have in mind when we confess our belief in the Creeds, “the holy, apostolic church”?

No. That’s not the church. The church is much more than that – more holy, more divine, more important than an adjective or a building. It’s a people! Augsburg Confession VIII says that the church “is the congregation of saints and true believers.” The foundation of the church is built not on us – our events, our programs, our mercy work to our communities, or even our relationships with each other. Rather, the foundation is built on Christ, and His love for us! Christ says in Matthew 16, that Peter’s confession - that Jesus is the Christ - is the foundation on which the church is built.

Apart from Christ, we are nothing. We have nothing. We have no faith. No forgiveness. No eternal life. We are left abandoned in our sins and are turned inwardly towards ourselves because Christ has not changed our hardened hearts to obey God and serve and love our neighbor.

But thanks be to God, for Christ has won life for the Church by purchasing us with His precious blood. Only in and through His sacrificial act can the true church exist. Without His blood, we are just a social club. Yet, God makes the church by gifting Word AND Sacraments to the Church. Augsburg Confession VII says, “The Church is the congregation of saints in which the Gospel is purely taught and the Sacraments are correctly administered.”

So why does the Church exist? What is its function? We aren’t a social club. We don’t meet just to socialize with others – though that certainly is good! We meet together to grow in Christ, for He is the foundation of the church. We grow in our understanding of faith in Bible Study, where Christ reveals Himself to us in the Holy Scriptures. We are strengthened by hearing the Gospel preached in word, and received in material bread and wine. Only by receiving the Gospel that Christ gives, we are equipped to share the love and mercy of Christ with others. Apart from it, we will run empty, being left lonely, unloved, and in search of godliness and holiness.

Through these things, Christ makes us the church. He makes us His beloved bride whom He serves from the physical altar at that physical building at which we gather. Thanks be to God for the grace-dripping gifts which He gives!

## Lutheran Schools – A Local Mission Field

On the January Munch Bunch gathering, we heard from a Lutheran K-8 school Principal and the Director of a Lutheran Preschool and they both gave us wonderful insights of the needs of their schools and especially teachers. Not all churches have a school ministry, but any congregation can adopt a nearby Lutheran school. Our LWML groups can spearhead this initiative by contacting a nearby school's principal and ask what kind of help is needed, then get the church's members involved too.

The most important thing we can do is PRAY for our schools and teachers. Other ways to help would be to get a list of supplies that the teachers use and provide them (a Thrivent Action Team could help with this); if the school has a lunch program, do they need additional help serving lunch or watching a class so the teacher can eat their lunch; do the teachers need adults to help their students with reading; do teachers need help with grading papers or copying. The K-8 school Principal stated that we lose a lot of teachers during their first 3 years for a variety of reasons – one of which is financial. Maybe one or more groups can financially support a new teacher during her first few years of service.

If a school has a major project to fund or needs to purchase new equipment (Smart Boards, computers, playground, etc.), an LWML group might want to consider sponsoring and submitting a grant application to be considered for the 2024 LWML Mid-South District Convention. Those applications will need to be submitted to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President by December 31, 2023.

If you have a Lutheran school or pre-school in your zone, contact them and ask about "adopting" them or a first year teacher for the upcoming school year. If you have more than one Lutheran school in your zone, coordinate with the other LWML groups on who will contact which school. More than one group could adopt a school or support a teacher. Our Lutheran schools are on the front line of spreading the love of Jesus to children. They are a mission field of both church and unchurched children and we are Women in Mission. Sounds like a match made on earth to me!

## Gifts of Love Ministry

Ministry leaders often appreciate unrestricted gifts to their organization that allow leaders to apply the dollars to the current pressing needs when received. A danger of such unrestricted gifts is that they can become generic in our minds, and we don't imagine what the benefit will be some day, robbing God's intended response of joy from giving ("God loves a cheerful giver"). However, predicting future needs can be tricky.

Three sisters taught Sunday School for all their adult lives. They loved children and appreciated the chance to share Jesus with them. Their estate plans all included gifts to support the Sunday School. But today, that same congregation is planted in a community where only 1.5% of the people are below the age of 18. You can see how difficult it would be for the congregation to use substantial gifts for supporting Sunday School when there are no children.

Gifts can be earmarked for certain ministry projects. Yet it is always a good idea to include language that gives ministry ability to redirect dollars if the planned need no longer exists in the future. Learn more at <https://courses.osd.k12.ok.us> or google "Oklahoma School for the Deaf". Now is your chance to sign up! They are offering 2 parts, ASL 1 and ASL 2. The lessons are pre-recorded so you can do these at your own pace. BUT you do have to sign up so be sure and check them out. You never know when you might need to know just a little sign language like this example below.

And last but not least, please pay attention to the commercials that are being aired using or about sign language. I recently saw a commercial that had to do with classes that a student was to attend and by body language you could tell she certainly didn't want to be there with the professor who was going to introduce her to the class. Once she was inside the classroom and stood to face the entire class, they immediately signed "welcome" and an acknowledgment that made her feel a part and brought a smile to her face. You see she was deaf! It truly changes the mood and attitudes of someone when they feel like they belong. So, learn that sign language and put a smile on someone's face one day if you get the chance!

As another facet of our ministry, I will be attending a Heart to Heart Sister training session in Milwaukee at the convention this summer. I hope to learn more about the program such as how it works, who, when, where, how, etc., and then return to work with volunteers to help put our team together for this important ministry.
