

Open the Eyes of My Heart

Many of us are familiar with a praise song titled “Open the Eyes of My Heart” which includes the phrase “I want to see you” and asks the Lord to “Pour out Your power and love”. Clearly the song is based on Ephesians 1:17-20 which is included below.

...that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, (Ephesians 1:17-20, ESV)

I often pondered the meaning of the phrase “open the eyes of my heart”. Finally, channeling Martin Luther, I asked, “what does this mean?” How can my heart have eyes? Thanks be to God for my Concordia Self-Study Bible! And, I have to say, the NIV version of this passage is much easier to follow. But I’ve gone with the LWML standard which is ESV. Here’s what I’ve gleaned...

Paul is praying for the Ephesians. First, he asks for the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation. There’s the Holy Spirit again! And this time it is HE who is enlightening hearts. Then there are three things that Paul asks that the Ephesians would come to know:

1. *what is the hope to which he has called you,*
Because they (and we!) have the promise of eternal life
2. *what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, and*
Because they (and we!) have the Holy Spirit as our comforter, teacher, intercessor, and a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance – talk about riches!
3. *what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe*
Because they (and we!) can count on the incomparable power of our Lord God Almighty

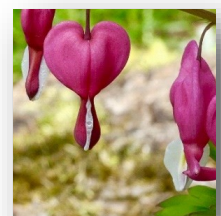
And THEN, we learn that this “*great might that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead*” is also applied to US! How amazing is THAT!? That same amazing love is also described in these passages from Romans chapter 8:

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things (Romans 8:31-32)?

For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8:38-39).

So, we ask that the “eyes of our hearts” will be opened to fully understand this unimaginable, immeasurable love that God has for us. May the joy of your salvation forever live in your hearts!

When God Calls You Home

No one really likes to talk about death but as Sally Field stated in the movie *Forrest Gump*, "Dying's just a part of living." If you have not made plans for your financial blessings when God calls you home or you want to update or revise them, there is FREE help available through LWML's Gifts of Love Ministry. Linda Gage is the Gift Planning Counselor for our LWML Mid-South District (linda.gage@lfnd.org, 716-946-8111) and she would love to help you with this process.

There are many options for making meaningful charitable gifts through estate planning and Linda can guide you in creating the best plan to meet not only your needs, but also the needs of your family or ministries you wish to bless based on your goals. Some of the options are a Bequest (leaving a gift through a will, trust, or beneficiary designation), Donor-Advised Fund (an account to support the charitable organizations you care about while you are living and after you've gone to heaven), Personal Endowment Fund (provides a consistent stream of funding to ministries you love during your life or after death), Charitable Gift Annuity (a way to receive fixed payment for life and the remainder goes to the ministries you love), and a Charitable Remainder Trust (a tax-wise way of providing payments to family over a set period with the remainder going to ministry). You can also support family and ministries through a beneficiary designation.

Don't wait until it's too late to set up a plan to share your blessings with your family and ministries **in the way you want**. By creating your estate plan ahead of time, you won't leave these decisions to your heirs in their time of grief.

Specific gifts from your estate can also be made to individual organizations such as the LWML Mid-South District Endowment Fund. This fund was approved at the 2020 LWML District Convention and has already reached the minimum principal value of \$25,000 so we are able to use the interest for individual scholarships. Any dollar amount can be sent to the Endowment Fund at any time to help the fund continue to grow. Consider a donation in honor or in memory of a loved one or a LWML member, as a thank-offering for someone's birthday or anniversary, or as a special *Thank you* for all of God's blessings. For more information or to donate to the endowment fund, go to midsouthlwml.org/endowment-fund.

Mission Grant Committee Update

I cannot believe that it was a year ago in June 2022 that we met and chose our grants for the 2022/2024 biennium. This year has flown by. During this year, we have paid 71% (\$75,000) of our grants.

We go into this coming fiscal year with 29% (\$30,000) left to pay for our selected Grants.

This past quarter we have paid for one grant which was paid in April. This grant was for Hope House (Crisis Pregnancy Center) for \$8,000 to be used for a roof repair/replacement.

Our next grant to be paid is \$15,000 for "Cultivating Innovative New Ministry Programs" which is an LCMS Mid-South District program. I hope that we will have enough money in our budget to pay for this in July or August.

This will leave the following grants to be paid:

Concordia Seminary Ft. Wayne Financial Support for the Food Co-op to purchase food: \$2,500

Financial Aid for Professional Church Workers (Last two installments): \$12,500

Special Focus Ministries Update

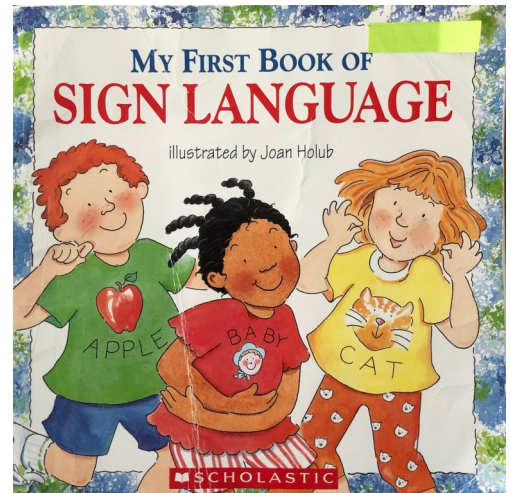

Know that you can contact your Leader Development Team anytime you need help. That is what we are here for.

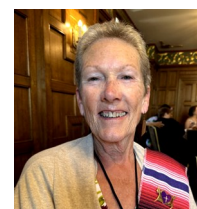

Guest speaker Nikki Tigg, Program Specialist and Interim Executive Director of Operation Saving Life, explained to the group the mission of OSL: to show the love of Jesus Christ by offering practical support to meet the financial, spiritual, and relational needs of women who have considered abortion and chosen life for their babies.



Attendees were asked to bring household and baby items to donate to Operation Saving Life, and the response was overwhelming, according to Tigg. The donated baby blankets, diapers, clothes, and cleaning supplies were too numerous to fit in the employees' vehicles! Fortunately, a volunteer who owns a pick-up truck was nearby and came to the church and completely filled the bed of the truck with all the gifts.



The meeting concluded with invitations to attend the 40th Biennial Convention in Milwaukee, Wis., June 22-25, 2023, and the Mid-South District Fall Retreat at Camp Garner Creek in Dickson, Tenn., Sept. 22-24, 2023. After the meeting, the women (and Rolland, pick-up-truck-owning volunteer) enjoyed fellowship, laughter, and raffle prizes during a taco bar lunch. The raffle proceeds combined with the worship service offering totaled more than \$1,300 to benefit Operation Saving Life!

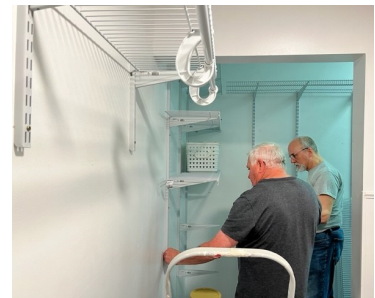
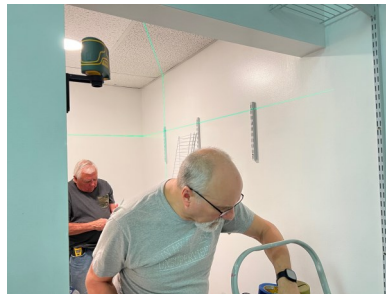


Check Presented to Hope House
