



Steadfast

A message from District President, Candy Habich

Sometimes random words come to mind and cause me to think about what they really mean. The word “steadfast” is the most recent cause for me to ponder. A quick internet search yielded an origin that translates to “firmly fixed in place.”

Well, I don’t know about you, but when I am firmly fixed in place it is usually because I am paralyzed by indecision, unable to move forward to action. However, the word steadfast, or the trait of “steadfastness” is used throughout the Bible as a very desirable thing.

Probably for us Lutherans, the best example of steadfastness is Luther’s “Here I stand.” speech. He was steadfast in his belief and would not waver. How many of us could do the same?

Digging deeper, using the ESV Bible translation, I found the word steadfast was used 203 times in the Old Testament and only 16 times in the New Testament. Refining the search to “steadfast love” resulted in 195 (96%) Old Testament hits and zero New Testament hits. Almost all the Old Testament references were to God’s steadfast love and 127 of those were in the book of Psalms!

God’s love truly is steadfast. It is eternal and unconditional. We can understand how David was bold to ask for God’s mercy in Psalm 51.

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin! (Psalm 51:1-2).

How many of you read Joel 2:13 and start to sing the verse before the Gospel message in the Lutheran Service Book Divine Service, setting two? And that even repeats the phrase “and abounding in steadfast love” just to be sure we get it!

(Joel 2:13).

We praise God that we have been able to pay all the grant requests for the 2022-2024 biennium! Since achieving that goal, we have paid the remaining portion of the grant to Eagle Rock Camp (\$3,100) and, with approval from the LWML MSD Executive Committee, the grant to Table Graces in Chattanooga (\$5,000). This brings the total amount paid out for mission grants in this biennium to \$113,200. Many thanks to all of you who faithfully support these missions!

Any mites collected through the end of this biennium on April 30 will be used toward the goal set for the 2024-2026 biennium. What a blessing to be able to start paying grants as soon as possible. God is SO GOOD!

In February, the Mission Grant Committee met to review the mission grant applications submitted for the 2024-2026 biennium. The committee's recommendation was approved by the LWML MSD Board of Directors. The list of mission grants is shown above.

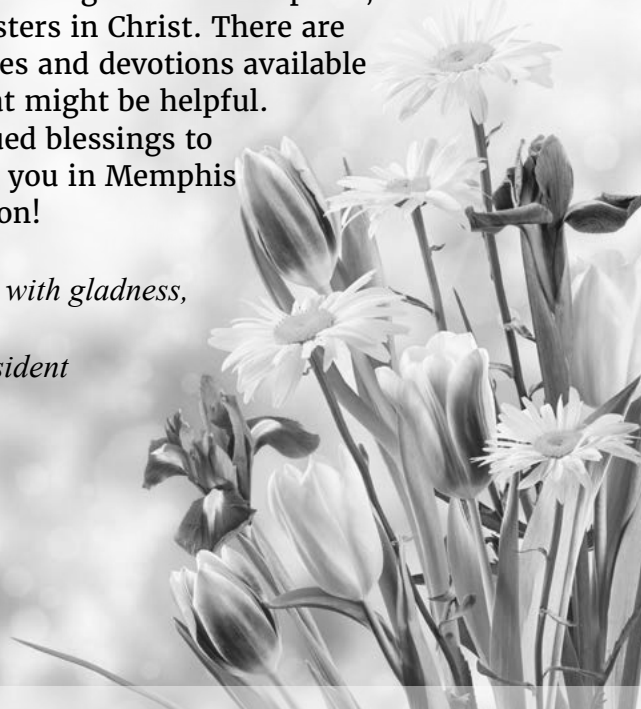

Glory and Rejoice . . . Early!

A message from Rev. Gordon Smith, Junior Pastoral Counselor

Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. See, I have told you" (Matthew 28:1-7).

... "the first day of the week" ... We are told on which day the women went to the tomb, to supposedly check on Jesus. On the first day of the week...not on the "week-end" or anytime else, but early on the FIRST day. And this "On the first day of the week," is echoed as John too, (John 20:1) tells God's people in his Gospel, was the day that only one woman, Mary of Magdalene, went to check on the tomb, which the church has used in reckoning what day to worship ever since. And it is in this understanding that we, even today, choose to have Sundays as our day to worship, contrary to others' use of the traditional Sabbath Day to praise God.

And of note too, is that it was "Early" on that day, reinforcing the idea that the people of God should put "first things, first." It is good for us, as God's people, to remember that we should start the week off with our minds on Christ, going out to be with him, and His people...all those who share this understanding that we should seek the

Lord first, to be in His presence and receive from Him His blessings, just as the Psalmist reminds us:

The young lions suffer want and hunger; but those who seek the LORD lack no good thing (Psalm 34:10).

and

Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice! Seek the LORD and his strength; seek his presence continually! (Psalm 105:3-4).

I write this having just begun the "Holy Triumvirate" with my first Maundy Thursday gatherings, looking forward to another later today, and then anticipating the "Good Friday" and eventual Easter services, where a good many of God's people will gather with me to seek the Lord while ending our reflection on His passion, and beginning this following week, "Early" on Easter morning, to remind ourselves of just how our loving God and Lord planned and executed our salvation, not only ours, but all those who hold fast to Him, our guardian, guide and stay.

May we indeed glory and rejoice in our awesome God and Lord. Christ is risen, He is risen, indeed. Alleluia!

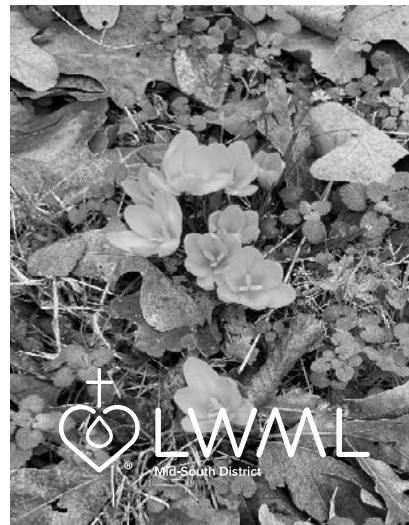
