TOXIC POSITIVITY

Recently, someone posted on Facebook a link to a Washington Post article titled "Toxic Positivity". I rarely click on things that people post but this one intrigued me. How on earth could positivity be toxic? When you grow up on Martin Luther's exhortation to "put the best construction on everything" you end up trying to look for something positive in every situation. And who among us doesn't quote Romans 8:28 on a regular basis?

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

The gist of the article was that we tend to placate people who are truly worried and concerned about their situation by telling them "it's going to be OK". When, from their viewpoint, they can't possibly see how that can be. As Christians, we know in our hearts that everything is going to be even better than OK because we are looking forward to spending eternity in Heaven. But, to a non-believer who is out of a job, can't make ends meet, or who has serious health issues, telling them it's going to be OK just doesn't help. We must tell them WHY it's going to be OK.

That's exactly what we're told in 1 Peter 3:15-16 (NIV):

But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander.

It's going to be OK because we have HOPE! But, being prepared to give that answer to a total stranger with whom you may have 60 seconds to share that reason for the hope that you have is the real challenge. How do we prepare? We memorize scripture of course! I've listed just a few verses here, but I am certain all of you have favorites too.

It's going to be OK because the God of the Universe:

- Knows who you are and how many hairs are on your head Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care. And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows (Matthew 10:29-31, NIV).
- <u>Will never leave you</u> "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you (Deuteronomy 31:6, NIV)."
- Gives you His peace Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid (John 14:27, NIV).
- Promises that we will spend eternity with Him in His Kingdom "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am (John 14:1-3, NIV)."

Maybe the way to quickly share the reason for the hope that you have is to write these verses on a note card that you keep handy in your purse or wallet. Or, maybe you carry a copy of a small devotion book or a pocket New Testament. LWML Mustard Seed Devotions are great to carry too. There's even a new booklet titled Comfort and Hope (https://www.cph.org/p-33722-comfort-and-hope.aspx). Whatever you do, be prepared! You may be the one person that God chooses to give hope to someone desperately in need of it.

I have lost count how many conversations in the past months have turned to people asking the question, is this a Biblical indication to the End Times? I wish I could tell them that I knew that the answer was yes, because this is what they wanted to hear. I do believe that the day is coming quickly, and that Jesus will be returning to take us to be with Him, and the Father in heaven forevermore. But there is no amount of education or knowledge, no degree or piece of paper hanging on the wall that gives me or any other Pastor or theologian the insight to know when this will happen. I personally pray that it happens soon, but the simple truth is that only God knows, no person, no angel, not even the Son of God... but only God knows. Till that day we are to continue to press on and serve Him to our full ability as we wait, watching, be alert at all times for this day. Until then ladies of the Mid-South LWML... keep on doing what you are doing, preparing yourself and all those who you come into contact with for that day, when he comes like a thief in the night. Prepare your lanterns for the return of the Bride-groom... so you may be prepared to join Him in the marriage feast that knows no end.

There are changes in how we meet or do not meet to worship. Perhaps you are experiencing changes in your work environment. Some people are working from home, and others have had to work more. Some of you may have attended, or plan to attend a Zone Retreat or Rally. Others may be staying home. students closer to Some are school attending in person, some are attending school virtually. You may be ordering groceries online or making a trip to the store in person. We may have many questions about how long the pandemic will continue and how it will affect us. Despite all the changes we have experienced, we know that God is unchanging. His love for us is steadfast. He is in control of all things.

I am in two different Bible studies; one is studying the book of Genesis: the book of Beginnings. The other study is of the book of Revelation; the book of the world to come. I will be sending a list to each zone Quarterly chair with a spreadsheet listing the number of subscriptions currently requested for each society with the total cost. We have been able to match the cost of the subscriptions with the actual receipts coming in this year. We were able to close the large gap that had to be paid to LWML out of the district funds to cover the receipt shortfall. Our district subscription year begins with the Spring Issue, but the number of subscriptions is due in December for the next year. To assist in matching costs and subscriptions, we are asking each society to pay for the number of subscriptions requested to the appropriate zone treasurer. The zone treasurers will then forward the receipts to the district treasurer so that the money will be available to pay for the Quarterlies. The Quarterly subscription cost is separate from membership assessments Mites any or offerings. Thank you in advance for your assistance in keeping the numbers and receipts current.

Why Purple?

The official colors of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League are purple and gold. According to the Southern Illinois Lutheran Woman's Quarterly Supplement, October 1948, the Southern Illinois District was the first to adopt the colors of purple, symbolizing royalty, and gold, symbolizing value and integrity.

The LWML Executive Board adopted purple and gold at their board meeting held on July 24, 1951, The minutes of this meeting state: "Motion was made by Mrs. Emil Frank to recommend that the colors Purple and Gold as suggested in the Handbook, be adopted as the official League colors. Action – Adopted."

ENDOWMENT FUND NEWS

Thank you District Convention Delegates for LWML Mid-South The approving Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund Committee has had two meetings since the Fund was approved during the Mid-South District Virtual Convention. The committee members are Erin Foster, Chairman, First Vice President, Jane Hubsch, Treasurer, Mary Pruitt, and Financial Secretary, Sandie Harjala. As the President of Mid-South District, Candy Habich has a standing invitation as a guest and advisor.

We have made some important decisions regarding the fund. We have chosen two investment funds available through LCMS Foundation to invest the money we have set aside to start The Endowment Fund. One is a low risk, and the other is a moderate risk fund. We feel these are the best options until we see how the funds perform and how the economy does when the recession abates due to COVID 19 issues.

Decisions have also been made regarding who will be signing for the fund and who will be the alternate signer.

More about this will be shared as everything is finalized with the LCMS Foundation, but please be assured we all take this responsibility very seriously and have, through prayer, made good decisions.

The committee looks forward to the account being established and starting our fundraising work to bring the balance to the \$25,000 necessary to start distributing money as directed in the Guidelines. Remember we are starting with slightly over \$16,000 already so the goal is not far off. Please visit the LWML Mid-South District Website to review the guidelines, the Gift Acceptance Policy, and the bullet points that help summarize the first 2 documents.

A YWR will actively seek to be involved in her local LWML as well as encourage other young women to be active in the LWML.




The YWR Pin

What are your desires for your family after the Lord calls you home to be with Him? As Christians, our primary desire is that our family and friends will continue in their own faith in Jesus Christ. Writing down your confession of faith and sharing it with family is something with which your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can help.

When your earthly life is complete and the Lord has called you home, someone will need to manage the affairs of your estate, either a personal representative for your will or a trustee for your trust. But who should that be? Your attorney will provide guidance regarding legal considerations for that choice. But your choice also includes consideration of someone who will respect your faith and the attitude about Christian stewardship that lives within you today. Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can help you think through and pray through your list of choices.

A focus on wills is focusing on what happens to you after the Lord has called you home. But Power of Attorney documents or even a Revocable Trust can lay out your wishes for what happens to you while still alive on earth if you become incapable of making your own decisions. Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can help you to start thinking about those wishes, preparing you for working with your attorney.

You may have been asked at a hospital if you have a "Living Will." A living will expresses your desires about how aggressive efforts by health care workers should be on your behalf. Short of an easy decision, many practical, ethical and faith decisions are linked to this document. Your careful deliberation gives you a chance to confess your faith in Jesus. Your LWML Gift Planning Counselor can connect you with reading resources to inform your decision.

An Editorial.


